### Illinois Audubon Society

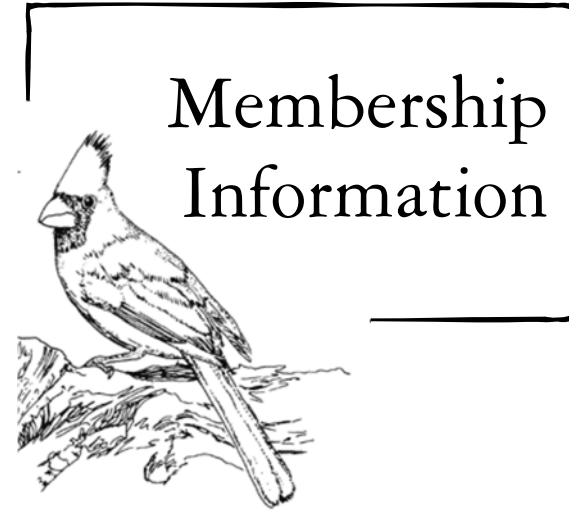
- Has over 2250 members including 18 chapters and 19 affiliated groups.

Founded in Chicago in 1897, Illinois Audubon is this state's oldest non-profit conservation organization. Pre-dating National Audubon, Illinois Audubon began as a small coalition of outspoken citizens fighting against the feather trade's decimation of heron, tern and egret populations.

With the passage of the Migratory Bird Treaty Act of 1916, Illinois Audubon's passion for protecting bird species and habitat remained steadfast. Through public outreach and education, coupled with compiling years of migratory bird nesting and seasonal survey data, Illinois Audubon's conservation leadership soon led to the protection of birds of prey including hawks, owls and eagles.

In time, Illinois Audubon's concern for wild things and wild places led to the Society's focus on Illinois' shrinking natural areas. Since the 1970's, Illinois Audubon has become a property owner and land trust, protecting nearly 4,000 acres of land now being managed and nurtured in perpetuity for plants, animals and human enjoyment and education.

## Our Gift to the Future

Since the 1970's, Illinois Audubon Society has saved over 3500 acres of land and water with an investment of over \$8 million dollars.
